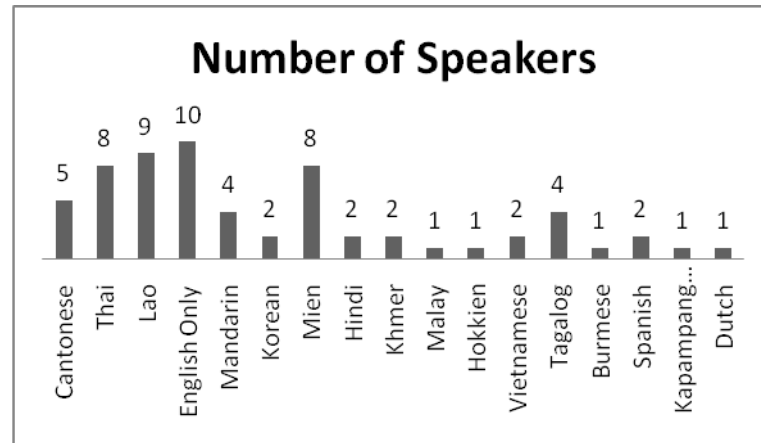

<p>APPS is a community-driven provider of behavioral health, youth development, and family support services to the historically underserved Asian/Pacific Islander community of the Bay Area. Strengthened by a diverse professional staff with roots in the API community, APPS understands families from various API cultures. The agency offers its services on a personal level, focusing on treatment in and beyond the clinical environment. APPS provides services to local schools, youth, and families. APPS is also uniquely positioned to provide leadership and a voice for API communities through community organizing, advocacy, and social systems transformation in the Bay Area. Together with key partner organizations, APPS is able to listen to the needs of the greater Bay Area API community, and respond quickly and effectively with appropriate services.</p> <p>APPS provides a variety of services in Alameda and Contra Costa County. The APPS Oakland site offers children's mental health services (individual, group and family therapy, case management); co-occurring mental health/alcohol and other drugs treatment for youth; and adult mental health services. Services are provided at our Oakland office site and at the following school sites: Oakland High School, Garfield Elementary, Bella Vista Elementary School, United for Success Middle School, and Edna Brewer Middle School. The APPS Internship will take place only in Alameda County.</p>

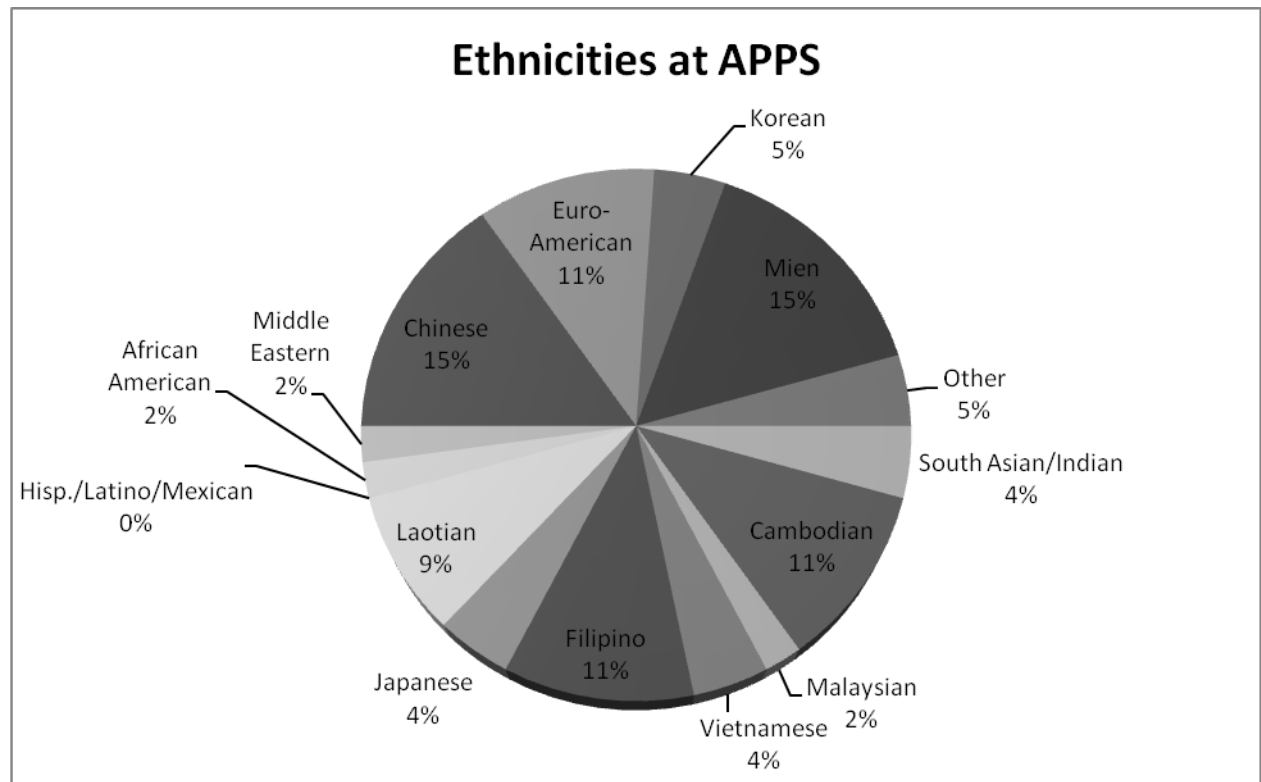

► **Describe practicum trainee duties and responsibilities:**

Trainees at APPS will receive weekly individual supervision (one hour/week) and group supervision (1.5-2.0 hours/week) provided by a licensed psychologist or licensed MFT. In addition, trainees will attend a weekly didactic seminar (1.5 hours/week) and monthly process group (1.5 hours/month). The didactic seminar includes readings, presentations and discussions on a wide range of topics. These include clinical interventions, professional development, youth development, and immigration issues to name a few. The monthly process group provides an opportunity for trainees to reflect on their training experiences and receive peer support and feedback.

Trainees at APPS will have the opportunity to provide individual therapy, group therapy, family therapy, case management, and collateral work as indicated. These services are provided at school sites (Oakland High School and Edna Brewer Middle School), in a traditional clinical setting, and various community settings including home visits.
