III. AGENCY DESCRIPTION: Please describe below.

Davis Street Family Resource Center (formerly called San Leandro Community Counseling) has been serving the East Bay since 1969 and has been training graduate students since 1976. The agency utilizes licensed and intern therapists to provide services to the community. There are two different training programs operating: school-based program and outpatient clinic. The former program offers individual and group therapy as well as workshops. The latter program offers individual, couple, family, and group therapy. The clientele is diverse (e.g., ethnicity, religion, presenting issues). The agency also offers a variety of psycho-educational classes, including parenting, anger management, and domestic violence intervention. For many years DSFRC has provided psychotherapy and consultation in local schools in order to address substance abuse, violence, and other psychological issues.
