The Family Institute of Richmond is a sister organization of The Family Institute of Pinole. FIP has been serving the West Contra Costa community for over 15 years. FIR will focus specifically on intensive, in-home services and working with trauma in ways that are meaningful and productive to the particularly high-risk community of inner-city Richmond and surrounding areas.

FIR serves families, children, and adults. Theoretical emphasis is on systems theory; postmodern views; and understanding the effects of social oppression.

The Family Institute of Richmond serves a very diverse client population, and makes training on multicultural issues a centerpiece of the learning experience. We make a concerted effort to attract a highly diverse cohort of interns each year. In addition, each of our staff has received formal training in multicultural issues; clinical supervision by an expert in multicultural issues; and, is currently practicing with diverse populations. Half of our staff speaks Spanish fluently.
