III. A. AGENCY DESCRIPTION: Please describe below.

The Golden Gate Conditional Release Program provides court-ordered outpatient treatment and supervision to persons from Marin, San Francisco, and San Mateo counties who are adjudicated as Not Guilty by Reason of Insanity (Penal Code Section 1026) when tried for their crimes and those who, while in prison for their crimes, were found to be Mentally Disordered Offenders (Penal Code Section 2962.) In general, this agency treats persons with major mental illnesses who have committed violent crimes. The Conditional Release Program is the California Department of Mental Health's community based treatment program.

Students will also be helping run our Day Treatment program which involves a variety of psycho-social groups. Students will be co-leading a psychotherapy group with another staff member as well. Students will also accompany staff to the California State Psychiatric Hospitals to do evaluations on inpatients who will be transitioned back into the community from the hospital.
