Setting:

Holy Names University is a Catholic liberal arts university serving students from diverse backgrounds. The university is located in the Oakland hills, overlooking the bay. 250 students live in residence halls on campus, and approximately 800 undergraduate and graduate students commute to classes. The academic programs on campus are geared towards a variety of students including traditional aged undergraduates, graduate students, and adult learners returning to do undergraduate or graduate studies. HNU Counseling & Psychological Services offers both brief and open-ended individual psychotherapy. We also provide group therapy; couples counseling; workshops about psychological issues and concerns; and crisis intervention services and consultation to the campus community.

Training Program:

The program provides training and supervised experience in both brief and longer-term individual psychotherapy, crisis intervention, consultation, program development, and outreach. The training includes 2 hours of individual supervision, 1.25 hours of case conference and 1.25 hours of didactic each week, and intermittent process group and training in special topics. The focus is on developing depth psychological understanding and applying it to brief and longer term psychotherapy with a diverse college student population.

- Small stipend.
- 16-20 hours per week commitment.
- Wednesdays from 9:30-2:30 are a required time.
- Theoretical orientation is psychoanalytic and Jungian.

Qualifications:

Practicum applicants must be currently enrolled in a Master's, Ph.D., or Psy.D. level program in counseling psychology or clinical psychology. Post-doctoral applications will be accepted on a rolling admission basis. Particular attention will be given to those candidates with clinical experience commensurate with the demands of a college community. Holy Names University is an Equal Opportunity Employer.
