III. A. AGENCY DESCRIPTION: Please describe below.

Laguna Honda Hospital is the largest publically held Skilled Nursing and Rehabilitation Facility in the United States. It serves geriatric and adult populations with complex medical, psychosocial, and rehabilitation needs. Residents in the hospital reflect the cultural diversity of San Francisco. The department of psychiatry within Laguna Honda consists of psychiatric, neuropsychological, clinical psychological and substance abuse consultation services. Our training program is well known with students going on to APA internships, prestigious post-doc training and leadership roles in their respective fields. There are two training tracks at our site: One for Neuropsychology Trainees and one for SATS trainees.

The SATS training track at Laguna Honda Hospital provides intensive training in substance abuse assessment, individual psychotherapy and harm reduction based group treatment for a range of substance use disorders and co-occurring anxiety, mood, thought, personality and neuro-cognitive disorders. In particular, trainees work closely with the interdisciplinary teams of our medical Rehabilitation department (Physiatry, OT, PT & Speech therapy), Positive Care department (HIV & AIDS) and are part of a team of clinical psychologists, neuropsychologists, psychiatric social workers, psychosocial occupational therapists and substance abuse counselors.

► **Others notes about populations:**

As part of the San Francisco Department of Public Health, Laguna Honda Hospital serves much of the under and uninsured population of San Francisco City and County. A high percentage of our patient population is unemployed, marginally housed or homeless prior to admission. Many have complicating psychosocial factors such as childhood abuse or other trauma, limited education, chronic substance dependence, criminal histories, and estrangement from social supports. Many also suffer from significant personality disorders and cognitive impairments.

► Describe practicum trainee duties and responsibilities:

Laguna Honda SATS trainees provide individual and group psychotherapy for hospital inpatients. Additionally, trainees provide consultation to physicians and interdisciplinary teams (IDT) primarily on the Physical Rehabilitation and HIV Positive Care units. Trainees conduct substance abuse assessments, write clinical reports and make recommendations to the IDT regarding treatment and behavioral management. Trainees attend and participate in SATS team meetings and assist with new program developments. Trainees report on new assessments and assist with coordination of treatment within the SATS program. Trainees are trained to function independently as a mental health professional in a medical setting interacting with a variety of health professionals including physicians, psychiatrists, nurses, social workers, physical therapists, occupational therapists, speech therapists, nutritionists, and recreational activity therapists.

► **Describe the Assessment Program:** Laguna Honda SATS trainees focus primarily on structured clinical interviews utilizing the Addiction Severity Index (ASI). SATS trainees also have the opportunity to perform additional mood assessment, personality testing, initial neuropsychological screening and health and behavior assessment on a case by case basis. Additional assessment tools include: CAGE, T-ACE, MAST, Beck Depression & Anxiety Scales, Geriatric Depression Scale, MMPI-II, PAI, Millon Behavioral Medicine Diagnostic (MBMD), Folstein MMSE, Cognistat, Trailmaking A&B and Clock Drawing.

The training year is divided in half focusing on Axis I and acute medical conditions in the first half of the year and Axis II and chronic medical conditions in the second.
